Be among the first to witness exclusive screening reels of the new, highly anticipated PBS documentary, *The American Revolution*, directed by master storyteller Ken Burns on March 19 at noon or 6:00 p.m. at the Historic Warner Cascade Theatre Museum. Through the hardwork and dedication of the Youth Services Department staff, the New Castle Public Library is a now partnering with the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank through the Child Nutrition and Youth Programs! Through this, we are able to keep the fridge fuller with healthy snacks such as granola bars, yogurt, cheese sticks, fruit and more at a lower costs.

This partnership is vital to us as we work to sustain the Kids Fridge program. If you are interested in reducing food

insecurity amongst our youth, consider being a Kids Fridge sponsor.

By making a \$500 donation, not only will your name and logo be included in print marketing, social media and electronic marketing, and directly placed on fridge, but your donation will allow us to refill the fridge a minimum of two times a month.

Since it's inception in 2023, over 8,000 snacks have been given out to youth patrons. In 2020, it was reported that the child food insecurity rate was 19.1% [Source: pittsburghfoodbank.org].
